Library Programs



We welcomed **23,850** of you to **1,182** engaging library programs.

We installed a 24/7 pickup locker at our Powdersville branch to increase anytime access to patrons.

We installed self-checkout stations in our Main, Pendleton and Powdersville branch locations.







We partnered with Anderson County Division of Parks, Recreation and Tourism to bring our first Storywalk to Anderson County, at KidVenture 2.0 playground.



We partnered with the Cleo Bailey Experiment and the Friends of the Anderson County Library to provide a Little Free Library to the residents in the Cleo Bailey School neighborhood.

We created The LEAP Station (LEAP stands for Learn, Experience, Adventure, Play) at our Main and Pendleton branch locations. The LEAP Station offers non-tradional items for checkout - like park and museum passes, birdwatching kits, SmartGlobes, magnetic chess sets, ukuleles and more!



Community Read




Our **'Books & Community'** community read program selection was 'The Story of More' by Hope Jahren. This book brings forward the importance of protecting the environment.

You joined in 26 programs that centered around the practices of recycling, gardening, composting and more.










Iva:


